I am pleased to relay to you that there is a strong sense of renewed possibility at OCC, and not just because the flowers are blooming. Last month, we were able to welcome in our first church for a Sunday night service since the dawning of the pandemic. Summit Church brought in a group of volunteers to provide worship and preaching for the population. There is currently a plan in motion to bring in a different church twice each month. This bi-monthly worship service will be in addition to the two weekly Bible studies that we offer, as well as various other spiritually focused programs that take place throughout the week. The men were so happy to see the folks from Summit, and I know that reintroducing our Sunday night services will have an invigorating effect on the lives of the residents.

Regarding invigorating effects...OCC has recently received four Labrador retrievers as part of a special training program known as ABEL. The dogs are being trained by residents and will eventually be adopted as fully trained service animals. Most of us are keenly aware of the natural morale boost that comes with the presence of a dog. We're so thankful for the folks at EENP for bringing this program our way!

Finally, I would like to share that we recently hosted our first Parent Day since 2019. Thanks to Melissa Radcliffe with Coastal Horizons and her wonderful volunteers (including Hillsborough mayor, Jenn Weaver), for providing this event for our men and their families.
